## **Introduction of Speakers:**

#### **Brenda Monarres 4th District**

Feel free to call or email Brenda with any traffic questions or concerns. They have added another traffic person to tackle these needs.

Forest Green is next in for paving. So if we can wait to paint edge lines until paving happens, it could be next Spring.

Greenfield Drive there is a curve. Sayre employees park on the road and only one car can get down the road. This has already reached Brenda to be addressed; it just goes in order of when they were received.

Forest Green and Troy Trail, just past the park. A pedestrian island is also in the works. This has enhanced crosswalk.

Spring 2025 tennis courts will be completely new. Demo and reconstruction.

Roundabout is still in plans.

They are looking at sidewalks in front of schools.

The horseshoe pits have also been brought to the attention of the city.

The mowing is great in our park.

There is a handout about the ragweed. There was a complaint about the amount of ragweed in the park.

Compliments to Brenda on a job well done for our neighborhood. She is very on top of things. Our neighborhood has never had this many things done in our neighborhood in such a short amount of time.

# **Charlie Martin (Sewer): Director of Water Quality**

He spoke one year ago.

3 million dollars have been put into solving odor issue. 2 at west hickman and one at town branch. It is still a work in progress. Smoke testing is getting ready to start. Pinnacle and

Cumberland Hill will be the first one since they are closest to the plant. The fall seems to be the time that this is the worst which is why they chose this time to do the test. Work will continue.

Questions: Note there are less incidents in Belleau Wood. Is this an accident? The plant got cleaned up and previous leadership went on. He is happy to take anyone for a field trip. The ash tank continues to cause problems for us. This is projected to be done by the end of the year. Lots of things are dependent on supply chain issues.

Gratitude was expressed that they are on the right track. They now have data to look at to figure out if what they are doing is effective.

# Victoria Meyer and David Lowe- (Park Initiative) Parks Funding Ballot Referendum

Parks are funded through the general fund.

All parks board members are all volunteers

What is a ballot referendum? Sometimes called ballot measures, ballot initiatives, or propositions.

Allows voters to decide issues directly.

90% of Fayette County residents visit parks

57% visit parks at least once a month

88% want upgrades to parks and recreational facilities.

#### Problem:

100+ parks require 8.5 million every year for improvements

The city's general fund has not kept pace with this need.

2024 study found \$123 million in deferred maintenance in our parks. (% of cities yearly budget)

#### Citizen-Led Solutions:

2024 ballot referendum creates a dedicated fund source for parks.

Funds are protected by state law

Delivers \$8 million annually for parks capital projects

Utilizes fiscally responsible funding mechanism

Enables pursuit of state and federal matching grants.

The average homeowner would pay about a dollar per week.

## Outcomes:

Transformational and sustained neighborhood infrastructure investment in parks, trails, open spaces, and recreational facilities citywide.

400+ projects remain in the 2018 Parks Master Plan

Improves public safety

Attracts new, high-paying jobs to Lexington

**Robust Community Support:** 

Public opinion poll indicated strong support among likely voters Unanimous Council vote advanced referendum to November ballot 100+ endorsements from business, community, and neighborhood leaders.
